### THE 1876 FUND

The community continues to grow to keep forging forwards and offering opportunities for everyone within the Lyonian Association to support current and future generations of pupils at John Lyon. The generosity of the community dates back to 1876, when John Lyon's original charter was re-established to provide education for local boys. Over 140 years on, and countless lives have been changed for the better.

## The 1876 Fund supports in distinct projects that directly impact John Lyon pupils.

1876 Fund donations are accumulated into the Development Trust Fund and used to complete varying projects around School that are 'over and above'. To qualify for funding, projects must be beyond the scope of typical budgets and the standard curriculum and they must benefit a broad range of current pupils. The projects are approved by the Board of Governors.





#### **FUNDED PROJECTS**

We will deploy £14,000 of the current total of £26,400\* in the first projects over 2017 and 2018.

#### **1876 READING ROOM**

The Excellence Programme is a new initiative and approach to enrichment for able and keen learners. It embodies all the very best qualities a student can strive for, supported by inspirational and dynamic teaching. It opens opportunities for a broad range of pupils, including those who may not get the top marks but demonstrate enthusiasm and motivation that can be nurtured to produce excellent results. Located in the Red House, the 1876 Reading Room has been designed for exclusive use of boys on the Excellence Programme and provides access to a variety of books, publications and research for furthering knowledge in a peaceful space. The décor of the room is in keeping with the heritage of the Red House and the School

#### MUSIC SCHOOL PIPE ORGAN

The pipe organ will be used for leading hymn singing, accompanying the Motet



Choir and String Ensemble. Pupils will have the opportunity to learn organ playing as a one-to-one instrument as well as participate in a Baroque Ensemble. Alongside the Steinway and Boston pianos, the pipe organ will complete a superb array of John Lyon keyboard instruments making a significant difference to the Music programme.

#### STEAM LEEDS MECHANICS KIT

STEAM is another exciting new part of the curriculum that uses Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics as

access points for guiding student enquiry, dialogue and critical thinking. Pupils will work in groups to design and build solutions to real life problems. Skills to be gained include taking thoughtful risks, engaging in experiential learning, persisting in problem solving and embracing collaboration. A Leeds Mechanics Kit will bridge the gap between the theoretical understanding of mechanics and physical understanding and facilitate demonstrations within the classroom to investigate linear and rotational mechanics.
