The Legacy Lives On!


The tradition of leaving wealth to the School started with the generosity and foresight of founder John Lyon, 1534-1592, who paved the way for a tradition of giving, which continues today!

Peter R. G. Watson (OL 1951) who died recently, was known at School for being a very kind and soft person. He was an important member of the Athletics team, running in different cross country events. He has generously gifted a substantial part of his estate to John Lyon in his will.

We are so **thankful for this legacy gift** which will make a huge difference to our goal of providing transformational opportunities for current and future pupils.

Robots are Coming

The 1876 Fund has provided the opportunity to **teach Robotics at John Lyon** by purchasing 10 Vex Robots for the School. Robotics will be incorporated into the STEAM curriculum from January and give the opportunity for every Year 8 pupil to learn the increasingly required skill of building and coding robots.

Pupils will have access to software that enables them to code robots and simulate their movements in a computer virtual world. Pupils will then have the opportunity to build robots and adapt them for different uses. The boys will learn how to control the robots with a joystick as well as through a computer code.

Robotics extra-curricular activity allowing those interested to further develop their coding skills.
